- Pretend Play with Infants and Toddlers**

Young children learn by imagining and doing. You have likely seen a child pick up a stone and pretend it is a zooming car, or hop a Lego across the table as if it were a person or a bunny. This child is using an object to represent something else while giving it action and motion. But this pretend play is not as simple as it may seem. The process of pretending builds skills in many essential developmental areas. We'll explore the many ways pretend play can support social and emotional skills, language and thinking skills. Shared moments with everyday household items can encourage empathy and emotional expression. This creativity and focus, two important school readiness skills, get a great start through pretend play interactions in these infant and toddler years. -Make Mine Breastfeeding Friendly

Supporting Breastfed Babies and Families in Day Care Home

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) has developed a web-based training for day care home providers to obtain their Breastfeeding-Friendly (BFF) designation. The 30-minute training is available on demand. To obtain your BFF designation you will need to view the training, complete the quiz, print out the certificate, complete the Day Care Home Breastfeeding Friendly Self-Assessment and submit the training certificate and self-assessment to your CACFP sponsor. • Intensive Technical Assistance (ITA)

What is ITA?

ITA is program designed to help YOU enhance your child care program. You decide on an area you would like to focus on and a day care specialist will provide assistance in your child care program. A day care specialist will work with you individually to schedule 1, 2, 3 or 4 visits. Each visit is scheduled for one hour.

What is the cost? There is no cost. Can you earn training credit? Yes!

• Animal Tape Rescue Activity
